## Organization:

Pack 110 was founded in the 1920's. We're chartered to Mt. Olivet Lutheran Church. Membership in Pack 110 is open to all boys and adults.

Pack 110 is a part of the national Boy Scouts of America, the local Northern Star Council (central Minnesota and western Wisconsin) and the Metro Lakes District (Minneapolis, Richfield, and Saint Anthony). The Council and District offer day and resident camps and camping programs and partnerships with area museums and sports teams, supply and uniform sales, support, and training.

Fall dues are \$25.00. New uniforms and handbooks are about \$50.00. Used uniforms and handbooks are often available - please contact us. Additional fees are minimal, especially if you participate in the Pack's Fall Wreath Sale.

## Pack Events:

Pack camps, events, and meetings are a time for all Pack families to come together for group activities and events each month. Awards that build confidence and self-esteem are presented along with season-specific activities that the whole family does together.

The Cub Scout motto is "Do Your Best." We offer Scouts many different activities and encourage them to always do their best with badges, patches, pins, and fun time spent with their parents and other Scouts in a safe, well-planned setting. This regular recognition and support helps build confidence and self-esteem.



## Den Meetings:

Outside of Pack camps, events, and meetings, grade-level groups meet separately in Den meetings. The Tiger Cub program introduces first graders to Cub Scout skills and values while doing activities with parents. Wolf and Bear Cubs (second and third graders) meet with or without parents to learn more skills and values appropriate to their grade level. Webelos Scouts (fourth and fifth graders) learn more advanced skills and values that reinforce their school work and help prepare them for Boy Scouting.

Dens meet once/twice per month. Trained parents lead activities following BSA program guides for activities in art, citizenship, crafts, fitness, nature, outdoor skills, safety, science, and other areas.

Cub Scouts learn and complete a variety of achievements in their rank's Handbook and earn awards and progress through the ranks of Cub Scouting. Achievements are earned at Den meetings, at camp, and at home with family.

Scouting promotes citizenship, outdoor skills, respect for nature, and self-confidence at all levels. A Scout's family and friends are always welcome at Den and Pack camps, events, and meetings!
